



Hornsby Junction Remodelling and Commuter Car Park

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

The Hornsby Junction Remodelling and Commuter Car Park includes building a new multi-storey commuter car park at Hornsby Station and upgrading rail infrastructure in the area to increase the capacity and reliability of the T1 North Shore Line.

This project is being delivered by the Novo Rail alliance on behalf of Transport for NSW.

Emergency weekend and evening work – Thursday 29 September to Monday 3 October

Emergency work to locate and repair underground services within the rail corridor will be carried out at Hornsby Station this weekend. This work will occur from **6pm Thursday 29 September to 6pm Monday 3 October**. Work activities will include:

- use of a sucker truck to remove ballast (rocks and gravel around the rail line) in identified search areas
- use of an excavator and compactor to remove some ballast and backfill areas once work is complete
- concrete and fence cutting
- use of mobile lighting towers to illuminate work areas at night
- utility and delivery vehicles in and around the rail corridor.

What you may notice

Deliveries of work vehicles and equipment including a sucker truck, excavators and lighting towers will commence from **6pm Thursday 29 September**. The project team will access the site via the George Street car park. Some of this work may be noisy. We will take every possible step to minimise noise such as switching off equipment when it is not in use and regular noise monitoring will be undertaken.

Traffic and pedestrian changes

Approximately five car parking spaces will be unavailable in the George Street commuter car park during these times. This will allow room for a sucker truck that will be used as part of the work being carried out and deliveries of equipment to take place. Access to the car park will be maintained at all times.

Workers and vehicles will access the rail corridor via gates at the George Street commuter car park. Traffic controllers and signage will be in place to direct motorists and pedestrians. Please follow directions and proceed carefully.
